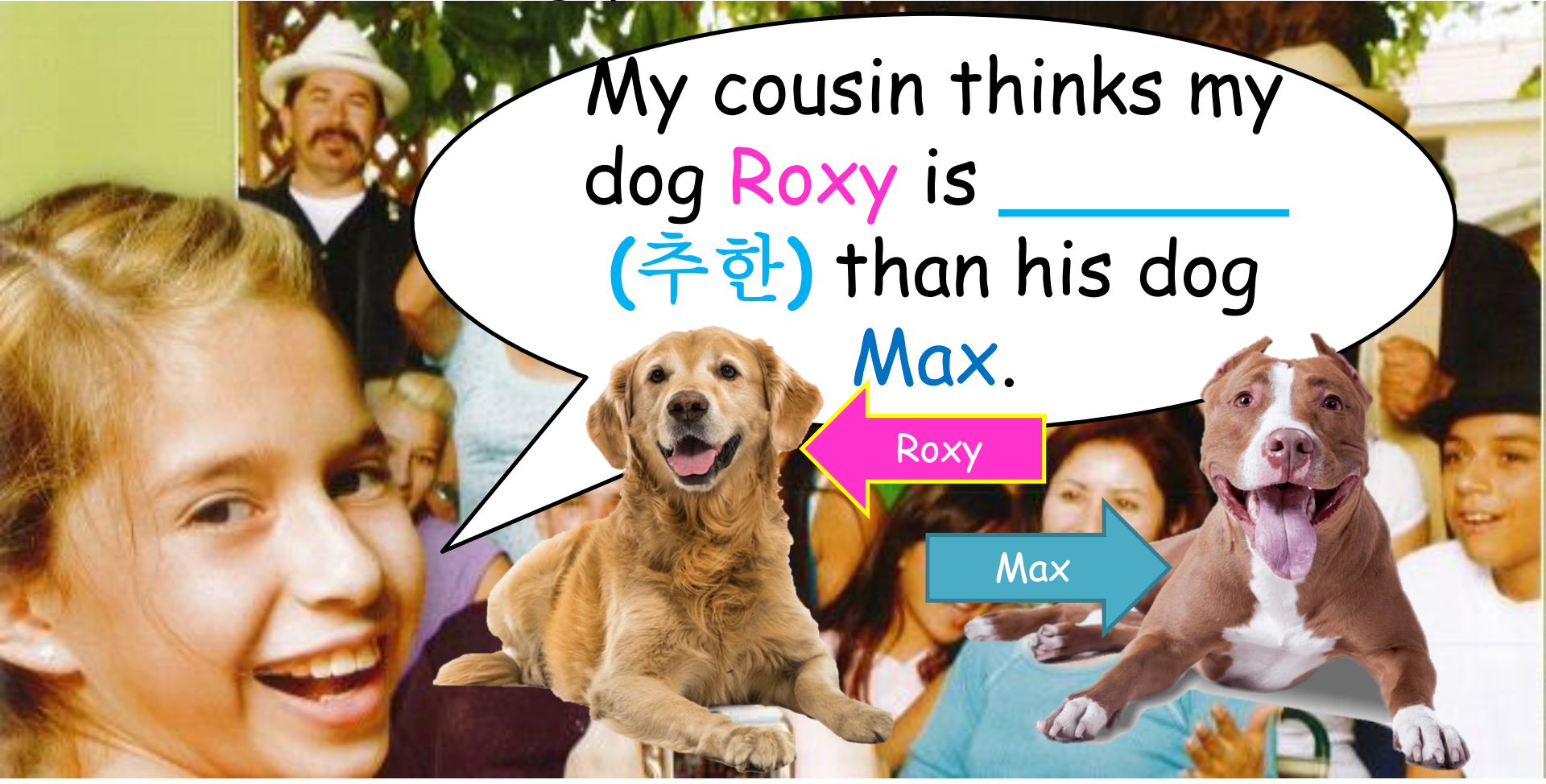

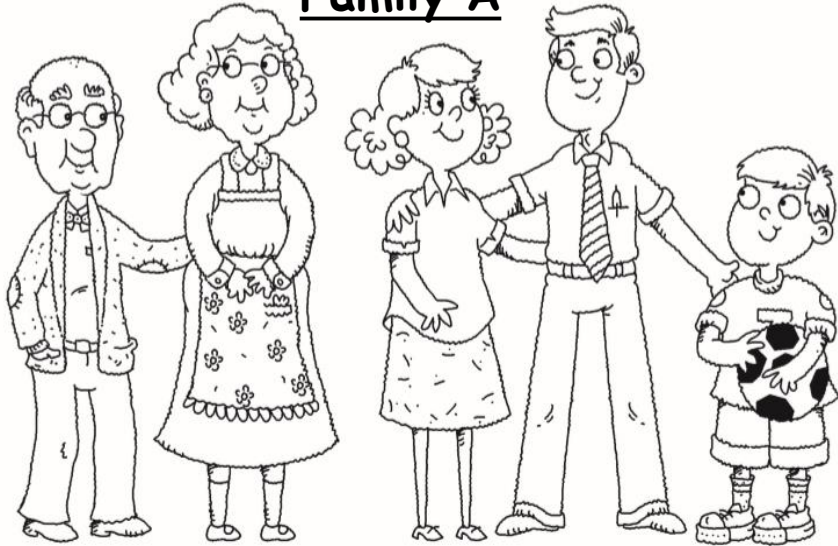

# COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES

When do we use  
-er + than?

1.) for short adjectives + **-er**

For example:

Old + **-er** = older

Tall + **-er** = taller

2.) If the adjective ends with consonant-**vowel**-consonant, double the last letter + **-er**

For example:

big + **-er** = bigger

fat + **-er** = fatter

thin + **-er** = thinner

3.) for adjectives that end -y, change y into -ier

For example:

busy = busier


happy = happier

funny = funnier
