- Asking for agreement or confirmation


There are two forms:

POSITIVE SENTENCE NEGATIVE QUESTION TAG e.g: It's raining, isn't it?

NEGATIVE SENTENCE POSITIVE QUESTION TAG e.g: She isn't reading, is she?


If the main clause doesn't have an auxiliary verb, we use "do", "does", "don't" or "doesn't" in the question tag:
